You still made the BEST sushi I ever had and I always dreamt about the next time that would happen again, in fact, we talked about sushi dinner several days before your passing. Always stylish, always one of a kind. You left NMHPU about a year after me, off to law school. Again many more sleepless nights getting through law school, clerking and volunteering your services to the homeless and the down beaten. And during this time you take up cycling with a passion, I'm thinking because heavy smoking and cycling go hand-in-hand and you needed something to do with all the spare time you never had. The awesome bikes you built were just beautiful works of art. Always amazing, always determined, always driven and always overworked, and yet would be there at a drop of a hat if you were needed. But you would never ask for help, or rarely. I was always so frustrated with you to ask me to help YOU with something. I do think losing your friend and mentor, Brian, in such an untimely, unexpected way was an emotional blow that affected you the rest of your life.
