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Elder Mair was one of my absolute favorite missionaries to serve with in Kentucky, and definitely on a short list of my favorite mission leaders. We had some great times when he was a Zone Leader in Muldraugh, KY and I was serving in Brandenburg (same ward). He would come to our area and work with us, not just cheerlead from a distance. His sense of humor was amazing. One time he and his companion were riding in the back of our car with us, I was riding shotgun, and my companion was driving on this two-lane road in rural Kentucky. Out of nowhere, Elder Mair tells my companion that he wants to read a scripture, and proceeds to read Doctrine & Covenants 58:21, "Let no man break the laws of the land, for he that keepeth the laws of God hath no need to break the laws of the land." I thought it was a really funny and good-natured way of giving my companion a hard time for speeding, haha.

In that same area, my companion and I were pretty far and isolated from the rest of our district in Elizabethtown, Being in the same ward with the Zone Leader allowed us to spend more time with him. My companion and I would alternate days being the one to pick who says the prayer each time we needed to have a companionship prayer throughout the day. Since we were isolated from our district, we jokingly said we were just going to be our own district and the Elder picking the prayers that day would be the District Leader. One day I shared this concept with Elder Mair, and in that great way of his he said, "Why don't you just start your own church? You could be the prophet!" Finally, on a more serious note, one time my companion and I were feeling discouraged and frustrated with things that had been happening with people we were teaching or trying to teach in our area. In those circumstances it was easy to blame it on the Adversary working on people and trying to dissuade them from listening to the missionaries. I probably said something like that, and Elder Mair said, "It's not Satan trying to hedge up your way. It's the Lord trying to see how bad you want it." It seemed like such an ordinary conversation at the time, but it has been amazing to me how many times I've heard that in my mind again in the 20+ years since then as I've been trying to overcome a challenge or do something good but difficult. It's heartbreaking to me that he has passed so tragically. So many times as I've recalled the experiences I've shared I've wished I could hang out with him and reminisce about those days, but now I've put it off for too long. I'll have to wait for the next life for that. As devastated as I am though, my heart goes out to his family. JD emulated the Savior's example of selfless love, individual worth and care for all God's children. Over 15 years later, I have never forgotten and will never forget that simple yet deeply impactful 2-hour game of catch with JD. I still distinctly remember the conversations we had. He unraveled a frustrated and seemingly lost teenage boy, and instilled a true sense of self-worth and genuine feeling of love that has lasted over 15 years. I am a father now to my first son, and I eagerly await the day I can play catch with him. When I do, I hope to help him feel the same sense of support, love, and worth that JD made me feel as a teen that Wednesday summer night so many years ago.
