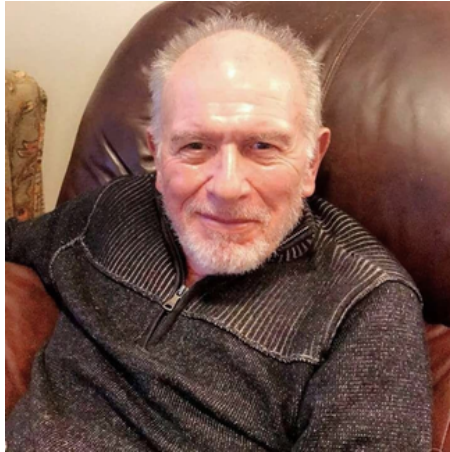




Leonard Stanley Ross
