The bus, driven by its wonderful volunteer Israeli driver traveled over a hundred miles each Sabbath gathering in the scores of saints who had come to Israel from Africa, Russia, Europe, China, Australia, and North and South America, then returning them to their dwellings after meetings ended. The bus ride also offered the occasion for home teachers to visit with families as they rode together. When the Jerusalem Center hosted district conferences the Relief Society found ways to feed hundreds between the sessions. Marilyn's influence among the sisters built love and mutual appreciation that influenced all saints who gathered. These were indeed wonderful times in the lives of the Latter-day Saints in the Holy Land.
