Roger Little has been one of my closest lifetime friends. We were both born the same summer to families living in the Yalecrest Ward (our mothers served in the Primary presidency while expecting us, together with Jeff Woodbury's mother), and we grew up together with a close group of boys, who have remained close all through the intervening decades. That group included Roger, Rod Dunn, Warren Clark, Steve Christensen, Lane Boice (who passed away a quarter century ago), Jeff Woodbury, Mike Vail, and Kelly DeVries, among others. In fact, seven of us had dinner together only a few weeks ago. Roger and I had many adventures together growing up in the old Yalecrest Ward neighborhood, attending weekday Primary classes, participating in Cub Scouts and later Boy Scouts, attending Bonneville Elementary, Clayton Junior High, East High School, and the University of Utah at the same time, going on many campouts, serving in our first priesthood assignments, memorizing scriptures in our old deacons quorum, creating grief for a long stream of intrepid Sunday School teachers, shooting sparrows with wrist rockets, flying remote control airplanes, experimenting with fireworks and other dangerous hobbies, buying and working on our first cars together (including his memorable and beloved Corvair), going on our very first double date together in high school (it was the Seminary "computer dance"), serving full time missions at the same time, and then comparing notes down through the years as we each pursued careers and built families. When Roger had his first bout of cancer as a young boy, we all wondered whether that was the end for him, but he is a true fighter, a warrior, and went on to win battle after battle. With all of his medical trials, he has been the happiest and most optimistic man I know. At our recent dinner, he was as happy and positive as ever, engaging each of the "Yalecrest Ward Boys" in earnest conversation, asking about their lives, and expressing joy in our most recent reunion.
