James Kenneth Henderson passed away February 23, 2018 in Salt Lake City, Utah. Jim was born March 11, 1952 in Salt Lake City Utah, the son of Ralph Kenneth and Betty Gene Joseph Henderson. Jim graduated from Highland High School in 1970 and Utah State University with a Bachelors in Watershed Science and Management in 1976. He married Christine Reynolds June 21, 1976 in the Salt Lake Temple.

He was part owner in the family business at Henderson Wheel and Warehouse Supply where he started as a salesman while attending USU. After receiving his bachelors, he worked in the warehouse as a counterman and then became an outside salesman.
