Maggie's sense of family was remarkable; always displaying great love, interest, and loyalty to her husband, siblings, friends, and especially to her daughters, sons-in-laws, grandchildren and great grand children. Maggie was our anchor, wise instructor, a generous and lovely mother. Her daughters and their families adored her beyond measure.
