Our beloved and precious Pearl; wife of Dick Heilbut, mother of five children, 24 grandchildren and 74 great-grandchildren, passed away peacefully in the early hours of Sunday, August 12, 2018, at age 87. Pearl was the daughter of Earl Antrim and Ilene Prince Beck and raised in Pleasant Grove, Utah.

Pearl married the love of her life, Dick Heilbut, on March 6, 1952, in the Salt Lake LDS Temple. Their union was a beautiful and endearing love affair that spanned 71 years, which included five years of dating and waiting for her fiancé to return from his LDS mission.
