Per Haugen was born on September 22, 1929 to Harald Haugen and Olga Petersen in Haugesund, Norway. As a boy growing up in Norway, Per spent his days roaming and exploring the beautiful hills and mountains of his small hometown. He led his neighborhood friends on many mischievous adventures. Per's world changed overnight as the battles of WWII made their way to the once peaceful shores of Norway. He and his family struggled greatly as their tiny nation suffered at the hands of occupying forces.

Per had an innate ability to lead and achieve. He was involved in scouting in Norway and earned the Golden Scout (Eagle) rank.
