He loved talking and discussing whatever people were passionate about, and would spend hours engaged in conversation.

Devun was an advocate for teens and spoke at TedX Salt Lake City, on his 16th birthday, about the power of young people to make the world better, and how adults could help them. He worked with his sister Cierra and their friends to build an organization that worked to help teens feel empowered and make changes in the world around them. He fought hard to make sure teens felt they had a voice.
