Thomas Glenn Kimble, 67, passed away Sunday morning after a valiant battle with multiple myeloma. He was an amazing man facing death as he was living life.

Their great love story began on their first date when they planned their entire life together. Kathi waited for Tom while he served faithfully in the Alaskan Canadian Mission. He was preceded in death by his father, Glenn, his mother, Bernice, and his oldest son Jefferson. He is survived by his beloved wife, Kathryn, his children, Natalie, Curtis (Anne), JoAnna (Dave), Suzanne, Eric (Tiffany), his sisters, Kay (Dan) Van Kampen and Mary Beth (Nolan) Costley, and numerous dearly loved nieces and nephews.
