Graham Robinson (G.R.) Mather, born March 23, 1930, passed away April 29, 2017. Born in Salt Lake City, Utah to John and Leone Irene Robinson Mather, G.R. dedicated his life to serving the Lord and anyone with whom he came in contact. He served an LDS mission to the Northern States where he met his future wife, Jean Wachsmuth. They were married in the Salt Lake LDS Temple on May 16, 1952. After Jean's passing in March of 2008, he married Sally Heath Udy on August 14, 2009.
