



## June Nelson Ostrander

*June 24, 1921 ~ July 28, 2016*

June Idaho Nelson Ostrander, age 95, passed away Thursday, July 28, 2016 at her assisted living in American Fork, UT. June was born on June 24, 1921 in Pocatello, Idaho and was the last of seven children born to James Joseph Nelson and Helena Petrine Christensen. Graduated Pocatello High School in 1939, then married William Gilbert Ostrander July 20, 1940, had a daughter Julene. They divorced and she married Theodore Truman Neighbors in 1943, and had two sons Kenneth Nelson Neighbors and Michael Ted Neighbors (who only lived 3 months). She loved ballroom dancing ( jitterbug champion) and her dance partner Frank Ellis, driving taxi cabs, being Daddy's girl, sheep herding, riding horses, bowling, music (loved Lawrence Welk), crossword puzzles, cooking and sharing her meals, loved her cat Che Cha, beautifully written greeting cards and lastly being with friends and family. She was preceded in death by her siblings Parley, Caroline, Roy, Helen, Joseph and Blanche; sons Kenneth and Michael Neighbors, friend Frank Ellis and son-in-law Kent Hoffman.
