Many local musicians got their start with Jimmy and his band. Jimmy played all over the valley for events of all kinds. The last few years he loved playing at various assisted living centers and memory care facilities. They loved him, and he loved them. It was a real pleasure working with Heart and Soul.

Jimmy (Papa) will be remembered for his amazing music, his ever-generous heart, his sense of humor, and his infectious laugh. He always had a joke or story to share; regardless of the topic. He was an animal lover and supporter of the Humane Society and his faithful companions; Wesley and Lily, will miss their loving master. Jimmy had an amazing miniature train set that he "played" with, he enjoyed nature with a lovely garden and loved watching the birds. He was also an avid fan of the University of Utah, and wore his red proudly through the bad years along with the good years.

Jimmy is survived by his beloved wife of 68 years, Barbara Jean, his son Michael, daughter Diana Payne, Son-in-Law Bart, and grandchildren Adam and Katy. His grandson, Matthew, preceded him in death.
