Bill spoke fluent Spanish, which helped him in his work and service in the church. He attended and graduated from BYU.

Bill and Carolyn raised their children in Southern California where he served in many capacities both in the church and the community. He served in the High Priest Leadership, in Bishoprics, on the High Council, just to list a few. He was elected to the School Board of Jurupa Unified School District in California and served as its President for 2 of those years where He was well respected.

Bill worked as a manufacturer's rep in various parts of the country and world. At one time or another he serviced parts of CA, AZ, Montana, Idaho, Mexico, Honduras, Venezuela, Ecuador. He enjoyed all those that he worked with and the different cultures he got familiar with. It seemed wherever he went, the people liked his gentle and thoughtful personality.

When the church piloted the Hispanic Initiative, Bill and Carolyn were one of the first to serve as Spanish Speaking missionaries, serving 2 years in the Galena Branch in Sandy Utah. It was one of the highlights in his life.

He loved entertainment, especially going to movies. He was artistic and liked to paint in his early 20's. He was very good at it. Each of his children have at least one of his paintings. He had a fun sense of humor and liked to laugh. Reading Louis L'Amour books was a favorite past time of his. He was very interested and knowledgeable in both

world and church history. He loved flowers, music, playing board games and doing puzzles. He loved BYU football, treats [had a big sweet tooth] and was an 'addict' for McDonald's Coke!!! He loved a good storm: rain, lightning, thunder, and all that came with it. He enjoyed visiting with people, found gratification in serving others, having callings in the church, helping with whatever things he could, and when he could. He was a gentle giant, kind, and thoughtful.

We love you Bill, Dad, Grandpa, Papi! Though we will miss you so much, we understand that it will only be for a short time. We will see you again, because we have faith that our family is forever.
