



## Robert Harper Meador

Robert "Bob" Harper Meador, 92, of Herriman, Utah, passed away peacefully, Friday, November 16, 2018 at his home.

A service to reflect and remember Bob's life will be held at 10:30 am, Friday, November 30, 2018, at The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, 14868 S Juniper Crest Road, Herriman, Utah. Burial will follow at Larkin Sunset Gardens Cemetery in Sandy, Utah.

Bob was born March 18, 1926 in Afton, Oklahoma, to Roy Cleavland and Grace Leah (Matlock) Meador. At age 16 his family moved to California where he graduated from Alhambra High School and then served honorably in the United States Navy during World War II. On September 1, 1951, he married the former Barbara Anne Bradley in Alhambra, California. Bob was employed by Certified Grocers as a Grocery Buyer. He also owned and operated Ace Contract Sweeping Service, spent time at Grandlund Candy Company and the import/export business. He always worked hard and provided for his family. In 1959 Bob and Bobi joined The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. In 1960 Bob and Bobi were sealed in the Los Angeles Temple. Bob was always active in the church. He served as counselor in the Bishopric, a clerk, stake athletic director, and worked with the young men's program. He and his wife Bobi served 2 full time missions. He especially enjoyed coaching Bellflower 3rd Ward young men's softball team who won the state of California Regional and Area Softball Tournament in 1971 and 1972. Bob's coaching on and off the field had a positive impact on many young men's lives. Bob enjoyed music, fishing and camping, and was an avid Dodger and Little League World Series fan. He also enjoyed reading, gardening and spending time with his children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren. He was known as Grandpa and Grandpa GG. (Great Grandpa)

Bob is survived by his wife, Bobi; twin sons, Larry (Annette) Meador and Jerry (Beverly) Meador; daughter, Michele (Al) Carter; and son, Roy (Celine) Meador, 20 Grandchildren and 51 Great Grandchildren, and twin sister, Mary Hudspeth of Athens, Georgia.
