



## Esther Ruth Thayer Manwill

Esther Ruth Thayer Manwill passed away peacefully at age 66, just six days before her 67th birthday and four days before her 45th anniversary of marriage to her beloved husband.

Esther was born on March 18, 1951 in Madison, Wisconsin to Archie Adelman Thayer and Helen Naomi Cushing. She is survived by her husband, Lee Stewart Manwill, Jr., her two older sisters, Naomi (Bob Allmon, deceased), Mary (Mark Kettle), four married children, Amy (Bruce Black), Keith (Maria Reiser), Alicia (Joseph Rawlins), and Kenneth (Kaylee Glover). At age 17, Esther moved from Wisconsin to Hyrum, Utah where she lived with foster parents (Dorothy and Wendell Pope) attending Skyview High School in Smithfield. She later attended and graduated from Weber State College with an Associate's degree in Radiologic Technology in 1971 and completed her internship at McKay Dee Hospital. Shortly thereafter, she worked as an X-ray Technician at Carbon County Hospital in Price, Utah, and later, at the University Hospital in Salt Lake City.

On March 16, 1973, she married Lee Manwill in the Salt Lake LDS Temple. Esther was an exceptionally loving wife, mother and grandmother. She was very active in the LDS church and served in many callings. At the time of her passing, she was teaching a Primary Class of seven and eight-year old children.
