She found great joy in all of their academic and sporting activities. Adrienne was the team mom for the La Canada HS Football team, during the time her two oldest sons played. She was able to raise enough money for the team to have a state-of-the-art weight room for them to train. She put her heart and soul into anything she wanted to accomplish.

She enjoyed traveling, sports and cultural events as well as a variety of outdoor activities (water & snow skiing), with a particular interest in whale watching. Being a member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints was a big part of her life. Her faith in Jesus Christ sustained her through difficult and happy times. She lived and made friends in Southern California, Oregon, Washington, Utah, Florida, and Nevada, but no matter where she went, family came first.

She is survived by her sons Casey Muehle, Eric Muehle and Shane Weston and was preceded in death by her beloved daughter, Lisa.
