

Alvin Julian Dansie

Alvin Julian Dansie, 87, a kind, gentle, humble, son, brother, husband, father, grandfather and great-grandfather passed away peacefully at his home in Sandy, November 16, 2020, after several years battling Alzheimer's and Parkinson's. He was born in Salt Lake City, November 9, 1933, to Julian LeGrand Dansie and Ruby Roxanna Sweeney. His mother passed away when he was four years old. His father later married Lyona Snow Andersen who was a sweet second mother to him and his older sister Dixie.

He grew up in East Millcreek and attended local schools, graduating from Granite High School in 1952. He attended Salt Lake Trade Tech for one year, before enlisting in the Air Force, where he served for four years, from 1953-1957. He was a propeller mechanic and spent two years in Japan. Upon his discharge, he attended Weber College in the Electronics Technician program, graduating in June 1959. Following graduation he married Linda Lee Harris in the Salt Lake Temple on June 23, 1959. He worked for many years for Sperry Univac, and later worked at several electronic firms, until he retired. In November 1968, while at Sperry, he was was sent to Vietnam for several weeks to work on a top-secret assignment installing special surveillance equipment in airplanes.

Alvin and Linda lived for a short time in Bountiful and Centerville, then moved to their new home in Sandy, in October 1960, and started their family of five children. He was a very skilled carpenter, remodeler, builder, and all-around handyman that could fix anything. He loved tinkering with antique cars and trucks.

He was a faithful member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints and had a strong, though mostly unspoken, testimony of the Savior and the Gospel. (He was not fond of public speaking.) He served in many callings in The Church. His favorite calling was being in the Nursery with Linda. He also enjoyed serving with Linda for eight years in the Jordan River Temple Baptistry, and two six month service missions at Heber Valley Camp where they lived in their vintage Air Stream trailer.

He is survived by his wife, Linda and five children: Stephen Alvin (Peggy Winkler), Diane Lee Wardle (Charles), John LeGrande (Heidi Jentzsch), Karen Straub (Dean), and Matthew Harris (Amy Jardine); sixteen grandchildren: Jennifer Dansie, Jacob Dansie, Benjamin Dansie, Stephanie Brandt (Daniel), Emilee Dansie, Melissa Wardle, Travis Wardle (Chloe Bickmore), Michael Wardle, Jesse Wardle, Brittnie Adams (Austin), Hillary Anderson (Ian),
