After waiting for 4 years, we joyfully welcomed Andrew James Brindle into our family when he was only 2 days old. As a baby, he used to love to make people laugh as he would perform in his high chair his funny antics such as his "Tense Look" to a captive audience. When Andrew was only 1 year old, his adoptive father went home to be with his Lord and Savior. At bedtime, one thing that Andrew and his big brother, Matt, would pray for was a new dad who ended up coming into their lives when Andrew was 3 years old. At the age of 5, Andrew became a big brother when Christian, the youngest member of our family was born, and with the two of them going to the same schools much of the time, he had many opportunities to watch out for his little brother. Andrew was a unique and remarkable child in many ways. Highly intelligent and very capable, he could figure out about anything. One time when his dad was showing him how to replace a headlight on his car, he was so amazed that at the age of 3 1/2, Andrew demonstrated that he knew which way to turn the screwdriver. He loved taking old electronics apart to see what was inside, a foreshadowing of some of the interests when he was older such as building computers and working as a mechanic, especially when it involved big equipment. He often had a mischievous twinkle in his eye, and his mind was always active. This would prompt his mother to say, "I can see the wheels turning, Andrew." As he grew, his interests expanded to a wide variety of things, such as music, sports, things, plants, and animals, and his thirst for knowledge compelled him to learn all about all of them and excel in each one. Andrew learned about God from his parents, his teachers at the schools he attended, the counselors and speakers at Pioneer Bible Camp and his Sunday School teachers, AWANA teachers, and pastors at Grace Community Bible Church. We are so thankful for all of the people who invested their time and energy into teaching our son about the Lord. When he was only 4 years old, he watched an old Christian movie on TV with his family called "A Thief in the Night". Shortly afterward, he decided that he wanted to invite Jesus into his heart. At his baptism when he was a little older, he made a public profession of his faith making it known that he was trusting in Jesus' death, burial and resurrection for the forgiveness of his sins. He knew there was nothing he would ever be able to do to make that happen. From Kindergarten through the 7th grade, Andrew attended Grace Lutheran School in Sandy, UT. He played soccer on the school team, and surprised us when he told us that the ute was the instrument he wanted to play in the school band. Like everything else, he was very good at it. From the 8th grade through the 12th grade, Andrew

attended Intermountain Christian School. He played on both the Basketball Team and the Soccer Team and also enjoyed playing bass guitar in the Jazz Band. After graduating from High School, Andrew attended Salt Lake Community College and the University of Phoenix. He was employed in a wide variety of jobs - computers, selling health insurance to Seniors, Technical Customer Service, warehouse man, and heavy equipment mechanic. At the age of 32, Andrew began searching for his birth parents and was successful in locating them as well as many Aunts, Uncles and cousins in both Utah and Minnesota. He moved to Minnesota at the age of 33.
