Our dear mother, wife, sister and grandmother passed away peacefully on October 3, 2024. Annie was born in rural Cleveland Virginia and was a self-proclaimed "hillbilly" with a love for Blue Grass music, the banjo and fiddle. Annie was born to Tavis and Bertha LaForce on February 12, 1933.

Annie grew up in a small coal mining town in the beautiful hills of Virginia in a loving, humble, hardworking family. With no indoor bathroom we heard stories of the value of corn husks and sears catalog pages.

Annie married her beloved husband Douglas Edward Robey on December 26, 1953. Annie supported Douglas whole heartedly and together they were blessed with 8 children. They lived all around the country, even spending 18 months in Saudi Arabia with 4 small children.

Annie and Douglas joined the LDS church in July of 1962. They were later sealed for eternity in the Salt Lake Temple in December of 1963. Annie was a devout member of her church and loved her Savior. She served in many capacities for the Church. She especially loved serving in the Seattle Temple.

In 1992 Annie lost her eternal companion to cancer. After being single for 11 years she was blessed to meet Edmund Wright while working in the LDS Cannery. In November of 2002 Annie and Ed were married in the Seattle Temple. Together they served missions at the Bishops' Store House and the Family History Library.
