



## Barbara Barton Davis Ralphs

Barbara Barton Davis Ralphs was born in Salt Lake City on September 30, 1918 to Charles Leonard Davis and Evelyn Barton. She lived her life within a four-block radius attending Douglas Elementary, Roosevelt Junior High, East High School, and the University of Utah.

She married the love of her life George Albert Ralphs (Bud) on January 9, 1942 and promptly sent him off to fight in WWII for four years. Barbara worked as an administrative assistant at the University of Utah for most of her adult life in the College of Nursing and the Music Department with Dr. Ed Thompson. She retired at the age of 84.

She became a member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints two weeks before her 100th birthday and was sealed to her family shortly thereafter.
