Berna was known for her organizational skills, good cooking and kindness. She served in many capacities in the LDS Church. An avid reader, one would often find her reading the scriptures or a good book, many of which she was still listening to on CDs until her final days.

People often described Berna as, "Classy, with great taste" and "faithful". She was instrumental in the lives of many who were welcomed into her house and life as she often mothered others in addition to her own children. Having more people in her life enriched Berna as well, bringing these beloved friends full circle.
