It is with profound sadness that we announce the passing of Bill Kurtis Watts, a loving father, husband, grandfather, brother, uncle, and friend. Kurt passed away unexpectedly in his home in Sandy, Utah, on December 20, 2025, at the age of 73.

Kurt was born on October 29, 1952, in Los Angeles, California, to Helen Audrey Challstrom and Billie Donald Watts. At the age of three, his family relocated to Salt Lake City, Utah, where Kurt would grow up surrounded by the stunning landscapes of the Wasatch Mountains, which he would come to love throughout his life.

Kurt spent his childhood camping, fishing, and exploring the outdoors with his family. Kurt graduated from South High School in 1971. He went on to pursue higher education at the University of Utah, earning a Bachelor's Degree in Accounting on June 7, 1975. He was a lifelong learner, with a deep love for history and genealogy, which he spent many hours researching in his later years.

On June 26, 1975, Kurt married Margaret Susan Holdaway, in Salt Lake City, Utah. Together, they raised six children in Sandy, Utah, where they created a warm and loving home. Kurt's dedication to his family was unparalleled—he lived for his loved ones, always putting their needs and happiness above all else. He cherished every moment spent with his children and, later, his grandchildren, whom he adored.

Kurt spent 37 years working for Mountain Fuel Supply and various associated Questar companies, retiring in 2012. He was well-respected by his colleagues, and many of his co-workers became lifelong friends. His work ethic, integrity, and sense of humor made him a beloved figure in the workplace.

Kurt was a convert to the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, joining the faith at the age of 24. He found joy in service and served faithfully in many church callings throughout his life and enjoyed the friendships with those he worked with.
