They were both faithful members of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. She continued to work as a nurse until the 1950s when she decided to stay home to care for their children, which she very much loved to do. Bonnie again worked as a Registered Nurse during the 1970s and 1980s. When Bill's health declined, they moved in 2004 from Lancaster to Salt Lake City to live with their daughter. Not long after this, Bill passed away.

Bonnie's positive attitude, humor and her close relationship to her Heavenly Father helped her during this time. She instilled those values in her children and made them feel very much cherished. Bonnie loved children, especially her own and her grandchildren. She served in many positions in Relief Society and Primary.
