Brian Peter Hudson, age 62 of Sandy, UT, passed away on November 18th after a brutal struggle with early-onset Alzheimer's disease. This cruel disease robbed him of his independence and precious time with family and friends who will miss him terribly.

Brian was born in Syracuse, NY to Phil and Sandra Hudson. He graduated from First Colonial High School in Virginia Beach, where his family moved when he was a teenager. Brian received a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree from Syracuse University and earned his MBA from Westminster College in Salt Lake City. He began his career as a television news photojournalist and spent nearly a decade working for KTVX in Salt Lake. After obtaining his MBA, Brian transitioned to (what would be) a 16-year career in advertising and marketing. He was an account supervisor with Publicis (previously Evans Group Advertising) and later at Thomas Arts, where he spent the last six years of his career. He is admired by those he worked with and remembered as the kindest and most generous colleague and friend.

Brian's greatest joy was spending time with his two children, Paul, 22, and Matthew, 20. He shared his love of sports with them, coaching their basketball and lacrosse teams and teaching them to ski. He loved camping trips to Moab, driving his jeep, taking prize-winning photographs, and cheering for the NY Giants. Brian was thoughtful, compassionate, and smart with a dry sense of humor.

Brian is survived by his father, Phil Hudson, and his stepmother, Lori Hudson; his sister, Kathryn Scovel; his children, Paul and Matthew; his stepbrother, Ashton Teske; his niece, Shannon Scovel, nephew, Riley Scovel, and brother-in-law, Curt Scovel; his aunt, Suzanne Hudson, uncle, Charles Hudson, aunt Peg Hudson, uncle, John Kerr, and aunt, Bonnie Kerr. Brian was preceded in death by his mother, Sandra Hudson.
