Carol's other interests at various times in her life were line dancing, belly dancing, painting, running, concert ushering, skiing, cake decorating, sewing, learning Spanish, tai chi, computer club, etc.

Survived by her beloved husband, Joe, and children Christine, Jeanne and Joey, grandson Anton and her cherished cat Tinkerbelle.
