



## Carol Graham Burnhope

*April 8, 1938 ~ Sept. 5, 2022*

Carol Graham Burnhope was born in American Fork, Utah in her grandmother's home on April 8, 1938, to Gib "M" Graham and June LaVona Crystal. She grew up in Murray, Utah on a small family farm with her sister Barbara and brother Dennis. She attended schools in the area and graduated from Murray High School. In the summer between her junior and senior year she met her sweetheart, Kenneth Burnhope.

Two years later they were married in the Salt Lake Temple on rainy May 10, 1957. They lived in Helper, Utah until November 1962 when they moved to Murray, Utah. In the spring of 1964, they bought and moved into the family home in the Murray/Holiday area where they raised their family of one son and three daughters. She lived in her home until her death.

In her life she was an active member of "The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints" where she held numerous callings in the Primary and Relief Society. Camping with family was always fun and enjoyable as she taught all of us the names of the wildflowers. Carol lost her husband Kenny to cancer over 5 years ago, and valiantly carried on.

Carol had a short battle with cancer and faced it courageously. She passed away peacefully at her home on September 5, 2022.
