She often spoke of what it was like when the fleet came in with sailors as far as the eye could see filling the whole street in downtown Long Beach. There were many drills at school and regular blackouts because of the local naval base. Her father worked for Douglas Aircraft and they had to camouflage their whole operation.

The family moved to northern California because of a change of employment for her father and they settled on the island of Alameda in the San Francisco Bay. She left home for a period of time to attend Brigham Young University in Utah where she studied Home Economics. When she went back to Alameda she became a Stake Missionary. It was in Alameda that she met Larry Blake who was stationed there in the Marines. They met at church and after a whirlwind romance they were married in the Salt Lake Temple in Utah. After completing his service, they settled in Salt Lake City where Larry resumed his studies at the University of Utah.
