At Christmas of this year, she was struck again and again; she put her valiant efforts to work to get back up. One thing was compounded by another by another until the last thing was added on the last day which overwhelmed her.

Charlene was born on November 3rd, 1944 in Salt Lake City to Dorothy Edith and James L. Jones. She attended Granger and Highland High Schools and still remains best friends with her schoolmate Ralphine Kennel. In 1985, Charlene and her family moved back to Utah and began a career with what was then a small outlying hospital, Jordan Valley Holy Cross Hospital, where for the next 25 years she became one of the hospital directors and it's very heart and soul. She was loved by the administrators, doctors and janitorial staff alike. She was also the chairman of the South Jordan Chamber of Commerce and acted as the hospital director of community relations with South Jordan.

She was a member of Epsilon Sigma Alpha Sorority and participated in their many philanthropic endeavors. She will be sorely missed by her beloved sorority sisters.
