On June 17th, 2022, Colleen Stacey Williams Glendening departed this world unexpectedly and was embraced into the arms of our Lord &

Savior, Jesus Christ. Though we mourn her passing, we rejoice in the promise of everlasting life and yearn to join her with the chorus of angels to glorify our Father in Heaven.

Colleen was born in Cold Lake, Alberta, Canada on October 23rd, 1968 and was born to Harvey & Maureen Williams; she was the second of

three children. As her father, Harvey, served faithfully in the Royal Canadian Air Force, Colleen was afforded the opportunity to explore Canada in all of its beauty. After graduating from high school, Colleen made the decision to explore new lands and opportunities in the United States. Having accepted a position in New York City, Colleen ventured from the countryside via railway on a daily basis. These daily commutes would later prove to be an act of divine providence as she would be led to Robert Glendening, her soon-to-be best friend. What initially began as a two-hour conversation among acquaintances blossomed into a promising marriage filled with love and admiration for one another. Their covenant began at the First Presbyterian Church in Washingtonville, New York. In marriage, Colleen devoted her energy to Bob's three children: Jimmy, Morgan, and Kristin. Knowing that his children endured emotional scars from a broken marriage, Colleen worked tirelessly to mend their wounds with unwavering love and compassion. Her capacity for maternal love was best demonstrated fulfilling her role of an adoptive mother to Kubendran Palani, Devayani Muthuselvam, Robert Steed, and Joyce Stewart.

A champion of the faith, Colleen devoted her life to the Gospel and empowered her brothers and sisters to make disciples of all nations (Matthew 28:19). Since 2012, Colleen attended South Mountain Community Church (SMCC) in Draper, Utah. Colleen believed something special always took place when people broke bread together with Jesus at the center. Colleen had a gifting for ministering to women. She empowered, supported and was a great listener. Colleen shared her faith powerfully, often without saying a word.

A lifelong learner, Colleen was a graduate of Central Collegiate Institute of Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan. Colleen was a steadfast and loyal employee who worked for Idea Nuova since 2002. At the time of her death, she was their Director of Licensing while simultaneously pursuing her bachelor's degree at Liberty University. She was less than a year away from receiving her diploma and had a 4.0 GPA.

One of Colleen's favorite seasons in life was her three years living in England. She was a huge fan and follower of all things to do with English Royalty. She regularly would go to see the changing of the guard at Buckingham Palace and was gob smacked at the opportunity to be on the parade route for Princess Kate and Prince William's wedding. Colleen loved to travel. During their time in England, Colleen and Bob time traveled to Austria, Belgium, Czech Republic, France, Germany, Holland, India, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Poland, and Scotland.

It's important to mention that Colleen loved fishing, but this was not something Bob liked to do together. Colleen regularly caught more, and

The quiet impact she made spans continents. Colleen went on multiple short-term missions to India. She was a generous supporter of the Hope

Indian people. Colleen took orphans into her home on a regular basis. She worked behind the scenes and felt uncomfortable with any kind of

recognition. Colleen leveraged her faith to help transform lives through kindness, compassion and generosity.

Those left behind find solace that she is reunited with those she loved including her mother, Maureen Williams; mother-in-law Bonnie Glendening; nephew Ryan Williams and adopted son, Robert Steed. As Psalm 34:18 reads, "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted; he rescues those whose spirits are crushed." The brokenhearted survivors include her beloved husband, Bob Glendening, her father Harvey Williams, sister, Sherry Hutt (husband, Ed, children, Daniel and granddaughter Laila Carruthers); brother Vance Williams (partner, Megan Smetzer, daughter Lily). Her step-children James Glendening (wife Rylee, daughter Ivy), Morgan Glendening, Kristin Newman (husband Jeremy) and adopted children: Kuby, Devayani and Joyce. Her father-in-law, Dr. James Glendening, sisters-in- law Tracy Kelleher (husband Mike, children Rebecca and Andrew); Lisa Glendening (daughter Emma), Jill Glendening Guillet (fiancé John Coombes, children Cyrus, Sylvia and Henry), Erin Bellomo (children Karsyn, Lanza and Gradyn) and Jaime Robinson (husband James, children Seumas, Beitris and Bonnie) as well as her beloved pets, Harry and William.
