Conrad Marvin Roberson, age 57, passed away on March 11, 2023, in Salt Lake City, Utah, after suffering an unexpected stroke. Born on August 23, 1965, in Mountain View, California, to Marvin Roland Roberson and Doris Jean Belbutowski, Conrad was raised in Provo, Utah.

He graduated from Provo High School Class of 1984, where he excelled in athletics. He continued his education at Brigham Young University, and was a member of the BYU National Championship Football Team in 1984. He served in the England Bristol Mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. He married Nancy Newman, August 4, 1987, with whom he had four children. They later divorced. Conrad met Chandra Lee Anderson Thompson, a widow of six years and mother to three children. He married his sweetheart on October 3, 2002, and helped to raise her "baby chicks." They were later sealed in the Jordan River Temple on February 14, 2015.

Conrad had a love for education. He received two master's degrees, and was truly a man of many talents. He worked in sales and marketing as well as healthcare customer advocacy. He was a patient teacher and found joy in serving others. He had a calming and soothing voice that provided comfort and safety.
