Craig Raymond Sentker, 79, passed away from heart failure in his home on September 16, 2021.

Craig was born to Gerda Schaar and Raymond Sentker on May 19, 1942 in Salt Lake City, UT. He was preceded in death by his wife of 38 years, Betty Darline Sentker. He was a jack-of-all-trades who loved Liquid Nails, duct tape, tinkering with electronics, computers, and countless DIY projects. Craig even designed and built his dream home after his childhood house was destroyed by fire.
