Surrounded by loved ones, Keith Baird of Pleasant Grove, Utah passed away on September 1st. Keith was born June 19th, 1934 in Salt Lake City, Utah, and grew up in Holladay. His parents were J. Reese Baird and Ruby A. Huish, and siblings Hugh, LaRee, Rey, Jim, Bob, and Charles.
