Dan rounds third and sprints to home base, sliding triumphantly in what will be the last play of his incredible career. "SAFE," yells the umpire.

Dan and his twin brother Don were born in Dallas, Texas on October 17, 1945 to Allan Woods and Helen Anderson Flandro. He enjoyed an idyllic childhood in the Parley's neighborhood where he spent his free time playing baseball, fixing up cars, building the family cabin in Big Cottonwood Canyon and being an All-American boy. He saw to it that their wants and needs were met, but always made sure they knew the importance of hard work and the value of a dollar. In his later years, Dan spent his time being a loving Grandpa to his many grandchildren. He rarely missed a sporting event or dance recital and found great joy in participating in all of their lives.
