Our dad Dr. Daniel Warren McAllister, 71, of Henderson, NV, passed away November 14, 2020 surrounded by his family due to complications from shoulder replacement surgery.

Born the 3rd of 10 children in Salt Lake City, he graduated from Highland High & received his Bachelors in Accounting and Master in Finance from University of Utah and his PhD in Business Management from the University of Washington.

Dad is survived by his adoring wife Wendy Hunter McAllister; his 4 loving children Michelle Fleur de Lys (Morgan), David (Rachelle), Jenny Grant (Chris), and Michael; and his 7 grandchildren- Sammi, Joey, James, Zachary, Jaxson, Cassie, and Danny, who are going to miss how their beloved Papa doted on them. He is also survived by his brother David and his sisters Susan (Jorge), Jami (Ernie), Ann (John), Julie (Craig), Joni (Rex), Lorie, and Lynne (Tony). He is going to meet his parents Warren Bennion and Maxine Burton McAllister and his sister Diane. Dad was a deeply spiritual man (Bishop in the LDS Church) who was completely devoted to his family. He was kind, thoughtful, and generous- from the stranger on the street, to the students in his classes, to the many people whose lives he touched every day. He loved to travel and never passed up a good pun.

Our dad has accomplished many things in his life- far too many to be able to list. Most important to him- he cherished our Mom. He positively influenced the lives of 1,000s of his students in his UNLV Business and Honors and Continuing Ed classes- he always said he would teach until the day he died, and he did. His efforts made him a Master Teacher, earning him the UNLV Distinguished Teaching Award 4 times, the College Distinguished Teaching Award 4 times, the department Teacher of the Year Award 9 times, LBS Master Teacher Award, and his own McAllister Day from the City of Las Vegas as well as receiving numerous other awards. In the history of UNLV, he's the only faculty member to have received Teacher of the Year honors in 3 different colleges (Business School, Honors College, College of Extended Studies).

Dad, it's going to be hard until we're able to see you again. As our Patriarch, you loved organizing things for us & made it so we could have 100s of family trips & other memories that will stay with us until we meet again, which we will. We love you. We know that you have heard the words from our Savior, "Well done, Thou good and faithful servant."
