Danny passed away peacefully on April 23, 2022, at the age of 71 in Heber, Utah after a long, courageous battle with Parkinson's disease. Danny attended Bingham High School where he excelled in wrestling. He later attended Weber State University to pursue an electrical engineering degree. He also had a great love of horse racing. Especially when he was the jockey racing. He would stop anything he was doing to watch any of the Triple Crown races. Danny joined the National Guard in 1967. But, due to the resulting injuries he sustained in a near fatal accident involving a haul truck at Kennecott, he was honorably discharged in 1972.

Danny loved his family more than anything and would do whatever he could to help them. Especially, his wife Barbara. He was always so proud of everything they did. And, bragged about them to everyone. Sunday was always breakfast day. All we had to do was call and ask if breakfast was on and he would say 'come on down'. Even if he had just run out of hashbrowns, he would run to the store to buy more.

Danny was a great teacher and example to all. He was generous and willing to help anyone in need. All they needed to do was ask. He would talk to anyone and made friends quickly and easily wherever he went. The store, movies, while on vacation, anywhere.

Danny was an avid lover of movies. He bought every movie known to man and loved going to the movie theater. You would be sure to find him at the theater every \$5 Tuesday. His favorite part was the giant bucket of popcorn with extra butter and his movie mug. He loved being outdoors and boating or driving his side-by-side. He also loved hunting and fishing of any kind. His favorite was duck/goose hunting with Jeff. He was a great shot and hit his limit quickly.

He worked at KSL TV for 28 years. He spent half of those years driving and operating their satellite truck 'Star Five' for remote broadcasts. From Utah, to California, Oregon, and Texas all the way to Budapest for broadcasting support for Utah's Olympic bid announcement. He spent the last half of his career with KSL working at the transmission tower on Farnsworth Peak. And, while holding down a full-time job, which included frequent traveling, he built his and Barbara's dream home almost entirely by himself. He was the jack of all trades, and his work ethic was second to none. There wasn't anything he could not do that he set his mind to.

He was diagnosed with Parkinson's disease shortly after he retired from KSL. And true to his nature he faced the challenge head on. He found a love of exercising. Most mornings you would find him at the Herriman recreational center. He gained many friendships there. We are quite sure that most of the time spent at the gym was more for socializing than exercising. They were like a second family to him.

He will be greatly missed, but his influence will live on with everyone he has touched. Danny is survived by his loving wife, Barbara; children, Jeff (Melissa) Andreason, Samantha (Shane) Strebel, Amy (Derrick) Harris; grandchildren, Kortney, Madison, Jessica, Cody (Cassidy), Alex and Axel and his brother Kit. He was preceded in death by his parents William "Bill" and Fay and his brothers Billy and David.
