Darrell's heart belonged to his family. He found joy in serving his family in whatever they needed. His children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren are the light of his life. Wherever his grandchildren and great-grandchildren were to be found, at school, at a dance recital, in a gym, on a basketball floor, or on a golf course, that's where he could be found. His grandchildren called him "Gramps." His great-grandchildren called him "Soda Grandpa," because he took soda and snacks to every event.

He loved playing sports and watching others play sports. He was always one of the most valuable players on any team sport that he participated in. Baseball, basketball, and golf were all fun to him. Sports served as a deeply woven thread that ran throughout the fabric of his life. Watching it on TV, participating in it or being with his grandchildren as they competed in a variety of sporting events was always satisfying to him.
