



## Deborah "Debbie" Evans

It is with love that we mourn the passing of Deborah Lynne Evans, who was called home on Sunday, September 5, 2021. Deborah "Debbie" Evans was a caring wife, mother, grandmother, sister, and friend, and we're happy that she no longer endures the physical limitations she had during her last years on earth.

Debbie was born in Ocala, Florida to Ralph Phillip Wyrick and Ida Ava Stephens Wyrick. The family moved to Knoxville, Tennessee when Debbie was a baby.
