Debra Taft Bogger passed away in Provo, Utah on January 21, 2022 of complication from the Covid-19 virus. She was born December 19, 1965 in Murray, Utah a daughter of Don S. Debra loved her dog Maddie, eating out, traveling, dancing, camping and holidays with her family. She was very generous, and would give her last dollar to help a friend. She could always laugh and find the good in everyone and every situation. Debra was very proud of her daughter and grandsons. She bragged about them to everyone she saw, even complete strangers. Debra has always been a fighter from the beginning to her very last breath.
