Del Fairbanks Gardner, 85 years old, passed away peacefully in Mountain Green, Utah, on March 13, 2025, surrounded by his wife, Linda, and several of his children. He will be remembered for his kindness, love for family and friends, and particularly his fondness for good food and bad jokes.

Del was an Eagle Scout and an active member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. He treasured his experience as a missionary in Australia and thoroughly enjoyed many years serving as an ordinance worker in the Salt Lake Temple alongside Linda.

Del was also a passionate sports enthusiast. He loved watching his grandchildren's games, the Utah Jazz, and any football games, especially those featuring the Utes! Throughout his life, he enjoyed fishing, hunting, camping, tennis, and basketball.
