DeLone Esther Jacobson Shupe, 94, passed away on August 29, 2022, in Salt Lake City, Utah. She spent her last 8 days on this earth surrounded by her family who she loved dearly. She was born on June 12, 1928, in Salt Lake City, Utah, to Aaron Carl Jacobson and Laura DeLone Emery. Dee was a big sister to two little brothers. Dee loved crocheting, crafting, camping, and baking. She was famous for her pies, caramel corn, cookies, suckers, Easter Egg dying parties, Christmas Eve parties, and anything that brought her family together. Her grandkids will always remember the pinball machine, game carpet, and the flashing speakers in the basement of her home where the best of memories were made. She was famous for inviting every one of her grandkids to sleep over all at once, much to Grandpa's chagrin. But "Her Majesty" always got what she wanted.

Dee was a supportive wife, a devoted mother, a loyal friend, and a very involved and loving grandma. She made her home a place where all loved to be.

In her later years, she and Don spent their winters in Yuma, AZ, and their summers in their 5th wheel traveling from Camperworld to Camperworld where even more great memories were made.

Dee's life has been full and she has been blessed with 17 grandchildren, 41 great-grandchildren, and 14 great-great grandchildren. Dee's unconditional love for all, her feisty personality (red hair), and sense of humor will be missed by all.
