The joy of service continued in later years where he served for over two decades as a temple worker, including the Palmyra New York Temple Mission. Don experienced deep spiritual growth and increased humility through his eleven years as a stake patriarch, offering spiritual guidance and blessings to countless individuals.

In his spare time, Don cherished moments spent with his family, creating lasting memories through camping adventures and soccer tournaments. He embraced the outdoors and nurtured a love for the beauty of nature, instilling this appreciation in his loved ones.

Don Carrel Reynolds will be remembered as a man of integrity, a loving husband, a devoted father and grandfather, a faithful servant of God, and a true patriot. In celebrating his life, we are reminded of the profound impact one person can have on their family, community, and faith. His memory will live on in the hearts of all who were
