One of her seasons of joyful service included serving with Max as ordinance workers at the Idaho Falls Temple. Together with her Sweetheart, they ran a successful family farm and an electrical appliance sales and repair store. Upon retirement, together they opened a successful Bed and Breakfast, The Inn at Deer Run, in Star Valley. They worked hard, beyond their energy and brought comfort, enjoyment, and happiness into the lives of others, during that venture. When Max fell ill and finished his mortal journey, Dorothy waited as patiently as she could, never wavering in her desires to rejoin him and return to her Heavenly Father. She was very close to Max in the days before her passing.
