With profound sadness, we announce the passing of Dr. Reauelle King on January 17, 2025, after a courageous five-month battle with cancer.

Born on November 12, 1972, Reauelle lived a life full of achievement, humor and love. She was an excellent student and valedictorian of Portville Central High School's class of 1991 and a 1995 honors graduate of William Smith College (Geneva, NY). Her passion for helping others and a desire from a very young age to be a doctor led her to SUNY Health Science Center - Syracuse, where she graduated from medical school in 1999. Reauelle started her career in family medicine before finding her passion in sleep – helping others sleep well. Throughout her career she was fortunate to have numerous colleagues who were also her friends.

Reauelle married the love of her life, Jeffrey King, on June 23, 2001. They shared 23 wonderful years together, raising three amazing boys: Jon, Andrew, and Rhett. She was a proud boy mom – a lacrosse boy mom – through and through. She so loved and was loved by all her lacrosse families.
