Earl C. Brown, age 92, of Sandy, UT, passed away Monday, July 18, 2022 from complications related to age. After graduating from American Fork High School he went on to attend the University of Utah where he enrolled in pre-law. Because law school tuition was much higher he took a quarter of school off to work.

It was during this time and due to the war in Korea he was drafted to serve in the United States Army. He was trained to be a Combat Engineer and after basic training his unit was sent to Germany. He was honorably discharged for medical reasons. After his discharge in the Army he met and fell in love with his sweetheart, Dawn Bateman. They were married in 1952 and have been with each other through all of life's ups and downs. They are the parents of 3 daughters, Sandra Malin (Leo, deceased), Carolyn Long (Richard) and Tammy Bradford (Kenneth).

He re-entered the University of Utah while working at Kennecott and received a BS degree in Sociology and upon graduation decided to stay with Kennecott where he advanced to Mine Safety Engineer. He retired in 1985 at the age of 55.

He was a handyman with a wonderful sense of humor, patient and easy-going. He loved to fish, golf, ballroom dance, square dance and spend time with his family.
