Edith Gibbons was reunited with her husband, George, when she passed away peacefully in her sleep on 5 September 2020. She was born in 1928 and was an Arizona gal through-and-through. She was 92 years old.

Edith was a wife, mother, grandmother, and great grandmother. She gave birth to 6 beautiful children: 5 boys and 1 girl. Her only daughter, Edi, preceded her in death. She has 35 grandchildren and over 70 great-grandchildren and counting.

She walked at least a half a mile each day, every day, until the last month of her life. Sometimes she would even walk her route twice a day. Few people are made like her these days; she had pioneer stock in her.

She would boldly declare her testimony of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and tell you she is on the other-side watching over you.
