Edward Arnold White, age 89, passed away on June 29, 2025, surrounded by family.

Born on May 30, 1936, in Salt Lake City, Utah, Ed was the son of Arnold Dee White and Erma Ruth Manwill. He grew up in Salt Lake and graduated from Olympus High School, later earning both a Bachelor's and a Master's degree in Business from the University of Utah (later mysteriously becoming an avid BYU football fan).

Their eternal partnership was blessed with eight children and a growing posterity of grandchildren and great-grandchildren, all of whom knew and adored him as the ever- playful, joke-cracking "Silly Grandpa."
