He became an esteemed business figure in Utah and his life story is one of resilience, hard work, and love.

Ed's early life was shaped by his service in the Navy, where he served on an aircraft carrier in the Gulf of Tonkin. It instilled in him a lifelong sense of discipline and resilience. After leaving the Navy, he attended Cal State Fullerton, where he earned a degree that would begin his pathway to future success.

In Utah, Ed established himself as a successful businessman with the founding of Central Bonds and Insurance in 1976. He also ventured into cattle ranching and real estate, and he was one of the owner/developers of the Soviet Housing Project, built in 1989 for Russian inspectors of local nuclear weapons facilities. Ed married Mary Beth Ballard. Together, they raised a wonderful family of eight children. The loss of their oldest son, Darby, was a heartrending chapter in his life. That marriage ended in divorce and Ed later married Shannon Thompson.

A man of many passions, Ed enjoyed the great outdoors, finding peace and joy in fishing, boating, and hunting. He was a revered member of the local Jewish community in Utah, known for his philanthropy and active engagement. Ed Golub's life is a remarkable tale of overcoming adversity, commitment to family, and making a positive impact on the community. As we say goodbye to Ed, we celebrate a life rich in achievements and filled with love. His loss leaves behind a hole that cannot and should not be filled. His strength, wisdom, and humor that he held throughout his life will be missed.
