Elain has always been active in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. She started serving as a primary teacher as soon as she graduated from Primary. When her three children were all in school, Elain went back to school herself and graduated with a degree in Elementary Education. She taught at Canyon View Elementary, beginning in the 6th grade, and then moving to 2nd grade where she taught for 24 years. Elain has been a member of the Daughters of the Utah Pioneers for many years and has enjoyed making many new friends there, and learning more about her pioneer heritage.

Elain's favorite thing in life was her family. She taught us so much about loving each other and set such a good example for her posterity. She was only blessed with three children, but ended up with a large posterity of 15 grandchildren, 38 great grandchildren, and 2 great-great grandchildren. Her influence on many others not of her own family will be felt for many years to come.
